Active Verb: Command those who are rich in this present world (The audience the verse is referring to: the rich) Those who are living in the present world (Now)

not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, (describes who to be commanded)

not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.

Contrast: arrogant / do good, be generous

who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.

Repetition / contrast: rich - fullness, wealth
